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State Fire Mobilization Authorized for the Ford Corkscrew Fire

Stevens County – State fire assistance has been mobilized under the Washington State Fire Services Resource Mobilization Plan in support of local firefighters working to contain the Ford Corkscrew Fire located in Stevens County, near Ford. The Ford Corkscrew Fire is burning in timber, grass, and brush. Washington State Patrol Chief John Batiste authorized the mobilization of state firefighting resources on August 15, 2021, at 6:00 p.m. at the request of Fire Chief Mike Bucy, Stevens County Fire District 1.

The Ford Corkscrew Fire started on August 15, 2021, at approximately 1:25 p.m. This fire is estimated at 1800 acres and growing. It is threatening structures, timber, and infrastructure. Level 1, 2, and 3 evacuations are in effect at this time. The fire cause is currently under investigation.

The State Emergency Operations Center at Camp Murray will remain activated to Level 2 to help coordinate state assistance for the Ford Corkscrew Fire. Mobilization specialists from the Fire Protection Bureau have ordered 3 strike teams and the fire will be managed by a Type 3 Incident Management Team. State Fire Marshal's Office personnel are both en route to the scene and working remotely to coordinate the dispatch of resources.

Under the State Fire Services Resource Mobilization Plan, the Fire Protection Bureau coordinates the initial dispatch and continued administrative oversight of resources and personnel for the duration of the mobilization. The Mobilization Plan is implemented to provide a process to quickly notify, assemble and deploy fire service personnel, equipment and other resources from around the state when fires, disasters or other events exceed the capacity of local jurisdictions.
