What's changing?

The Washington State Department of Licensing (DOL) added a medical alert designation to the driver license, identification card and instruction permit effective January 1, 2022. This alert will appear on the return indicating the person has voluntarily informed DOL they have a medical condition, are developmentally disabled, or deaf/hard-of-hearing.

DOL is also releasing the data regarding a driver's Ignition Interlock Employer Exemption to law enforcement. The exemption will allow a driver to operate an employment vehicle without an ignition interlock device during the restriction period. The driver is required to notify DOL of the exemption and carry the exemption form with them. Only data verified by DOL will be added to the driving record and show on the history return. Drivers may have more than one exemption on record so determining employment vehicles is still law enforcement discretion.
