Subject: CJISSECPOL Version 5.9.1 Released

Good morning,

The latest version of the CJISSECPOL 5.9.1 has been released and available for download at:

Most of the changes are to the Media Protection Section. See below a summary of the changes. I encourage you all to read through these sections to better understand the changing requirements.

- Section 5.8 Media Protection – This is the first phase into modernizing the CJIS Security Policy to fully align with NIST and includes a newly formatted Media Protection (MP) control family. This section in the old version was one page it has now increased to six pages. Below are additional requirements added to this section:
 - Media Policy and Procedures – Review and update the current media protection: 1) policy at least annually and following any security incidents involving digital and/or non-digital media; and 2) procedures at least annually and following any security incidents involving digital and/or non-digital media.
 - Media Marking – Mark system media indicating the distribution limitations, handling caveats, and applicable security markings (if any) of the information; and b) exempt digital and non-digital media containing CJI from marking if the media remain within physically secure locations and controlled areas.
 - Media Use – Restrict the use of digital media and non-digital media on agency-owned systems that have been approved for use in the storage, processing, or transmission of CJI by using technical, physical, or administrative controls; and b) prohibit the use of personally-owned digital media devices on all agency owned or controlled systems that store, process, or transmit CJI; and c) prohibit the use of digital media devices on all agency-owned or controlled systems that store, process, or transmit CJI when such devices have no identifiable owner.
- Section 5.12 Personnel Security and Appendix G.3 Cloud Computing – This version includes the CJIS Advisory Policy Board’s Interpretive Guidance Task Force recommendations on cloud service offerings and guidance related to personnel screening of cloud service personnel.
