POLYGRAPH & BACKGROUND INVESTIGATION

All candidates must undergo a polygraph examination and comprehensive background investigation, including a criminal history review, before hire. The Washington State Patrol enforces strict standards regarding personal conduct, employment history, arrests, convictions, and illegal drug use. Providing false or misleading information, or omitting details, will result in disqualification from employment consideration.

OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPTS

Education verification is required during the selection process. Top candidates must verify all position-required or self-reported education. The Human Resource Division will request official transcripts if you are selected as a top candidate.

VETERAN'S PREFERENCE

Applicants wishing to claim veterans' preference **MUST** attach a copy of their DD-214 (Member 4 copy), NGB 22, or signed verification of service letter from the United States Department of Veterans Affairs to their application. Please blackout any personally identifiable data such as social security numbers. Veterans' preference will not be applied unless the required documentation is attached to your application.
