**Agency:** Washington State Patrol

**Subject of possible rule making:** WAC 204-21-020 Definitions, WAC 204-21-130 Emergency lamps, WAC 204-21-170 Additional lighting for snow removal, highway maintenance and refuse haulers, and WAC 204-21-230 Lighting equipment prohibited.

**Statutes authorizing the agency to adopt rules on this subject:** RCW 46.37.005, 46.37.194 46.37.300 and 46.37.320

**Reasons why rules on this subject may be needed and what they might accomplish:** Proposed changes to WAC 204-21-020, 204-21-130, 204-21-170, and 204-21-230 are intended to allow state, county, and municipal snow removal plow and highway maintenance vehicles, including truck-mounted attenuators, to use flashing green and white lights in addition to amber lights while at the site of operations, which would enhance visibility and provide motorists with a clear warning of hazardous equipment or active maintenance operations. The definition section would be updated to include definitions for snow removal plow and highway maintenance vehicles and provide that copies of SAE standards may be obtained from SAE International, rather than from the Washington State Patrol. Finally, minor, non-substantive edits would clarify existing language to reduce potential confusion and improve readability.
