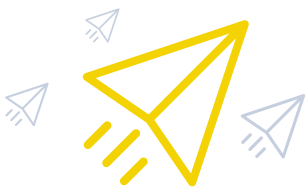

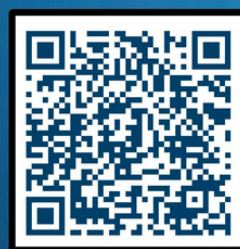
Trooper Grandstaff independently retrieved the SWAT BearCat from Fleet in Tumwater to represent his detachment and the team at the event. Great job representing the agency!



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
